## **The science of clean water**

Water is essential for life and here in Northern Ireland we are lucky to have a plentiful supply of fresh water in our rivers, lakes and reservoirs which not only provide wonderful habitats for wildlife but also are a vital supply of our tap water.

We all rely on clean safe water every day to keep us hydrated and healthy but before it reaches our taps this water must be cleaned and made safe to drink. The treatment process makes sure all dirt and germs are removed and uses lots of science to ensure the water is safe before reaching our taps.

Over 100 Scientists work for NI Water and they have the very important job of checking and testing the water before it reaches our taps. In fact they test the water over 120,000 times every year, taking water samples from our reservoirs, treatment works and homes and bringing it to our NI Water Science Labs to test it, making sure we get safe quality water to our taps every time we use it.

This year we would like pupils to help us celebrate the Science of Clean Water and the important role scientists play in ensuring clean, safe water comes out of the tap.

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## 'The Science of Clean Water' Competition Guidelines

### Instructions for Teachers:

1. Competition is open to all KS2 pupils with a category for Special Needs Schools.
2. Prizes for each primary school year group P5, P6 and P7 and for the Special Needs Schools category (all ages groups):
  - a) First prize - Monetary donation for the winning school in each category/ with a "goody bag" for winning pupil.

  - c) Third prize - Monetary donation for the winning school in each category/ with a "goody bag" for winning pupil.
3. The pupils are asked to draw a poster to celebrate the Science of Clean Water and the important role scientists play in ensuring clean, safe water comes out of the tap.
4. Posters **MUST** be A3 size and hand drawn (**we cannot accept any ICT posters**).
5. Each poster **MUST** have the pupils name and class clearly written on the back of the poster alongside the school's name and address. **Unfortunately, any posters, which do not include this information, will be disqualified.**
6. Entries should reach NI Water by 5pm Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2025.
