Wastewater Discharges to Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works

## **REQUESTS & RESPONSES**

- Do discharges via the sewage system at Antrim Area Hospital drain solely to the Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works? Any connections from Antrim Area hospital will discharge into the sewerage network on the Bush Road which will gravitate to Antrim WwTW for treatment.
- Is the waste sludge from Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works sent for incineration or repurposed for agricultural use?
  All Sludge at Antrim WwTW is dewatered to produce Sludge Cake which is taken to the incinerator for incineration.
- 3. Is some of the wastewater from Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works used for irrigation or does it all flow directly into Lough Neagh? Wastewater effluent which discharges to Antrim WwTW is treated in accordance with the Water Order Consent and Final treated effluent discharges to Lough Neagh.
- 4. What is the flow rate of wastewater from Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works into Lough Neagh?

The average flow rate of treated wastewater effluent, from Antrim WwTW into Lough Neagh during the Month of May was 150l/s, as permitted under the Water order Consent.

 Are NI Water or NI Water contractors aware of any wastewater distribution models for the dispersion of wastewater in Lough Neagh?
NI Water are not aware of wastewater dispersion modelling in Lough Neagh.

Daily DWF is not recorded – Full Flow to Treatment and FA1 flows are recorded and sent to the NI Environment Agency on a monthly basis. The consented daily DWF for Antrim Wastewater Treatment Works is 14462m3/day (cubic metres per day).
